





Map 15.4 The Atlantic World

Triangles of Trade








Olaudah Equiano (1745-1797)

- Bought by slave traders within Africa as a child.
- Bought by a British Naval officer in Barbados
- Bought by sugar and rum dealer
- Bought his own freedom when he was 21
