# Greek Phalanx


*A sixth-century B.C.E. oil container produced in Corinth. Corinthian pottery was the most popular of all such work for over 200 years, and many examples of it are found throughout the Mediterranean region.*



Background: Of the nine archons, three were more ancient offices. The original archon presided over the aristocratic council and meetings of the assembly. The polemarch was military commander. The office of king was reduced in status to one of the archons. The basileus, as the king was known, was responsible for public rituals and ceremonies. The six additional archons served as judges.
