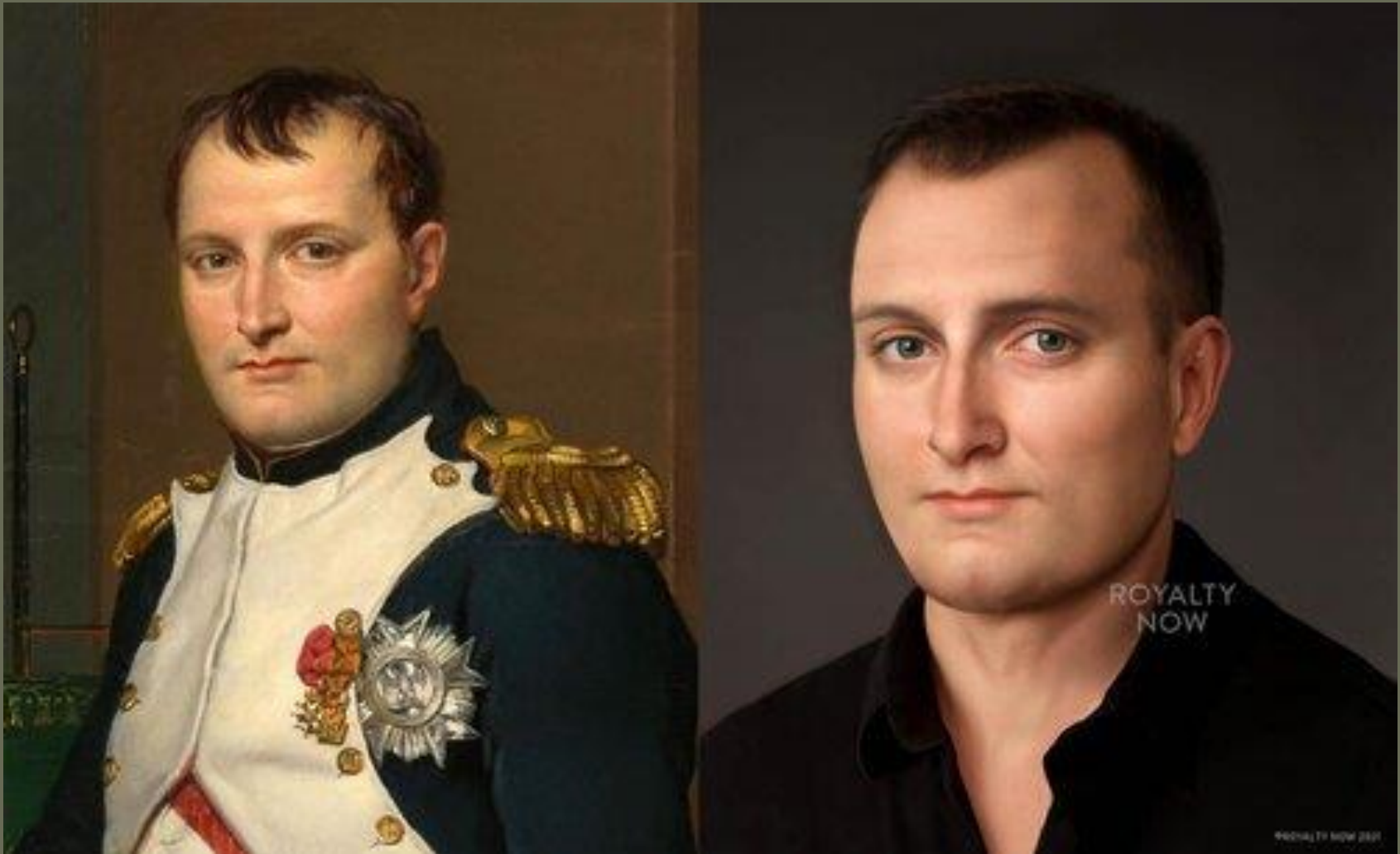

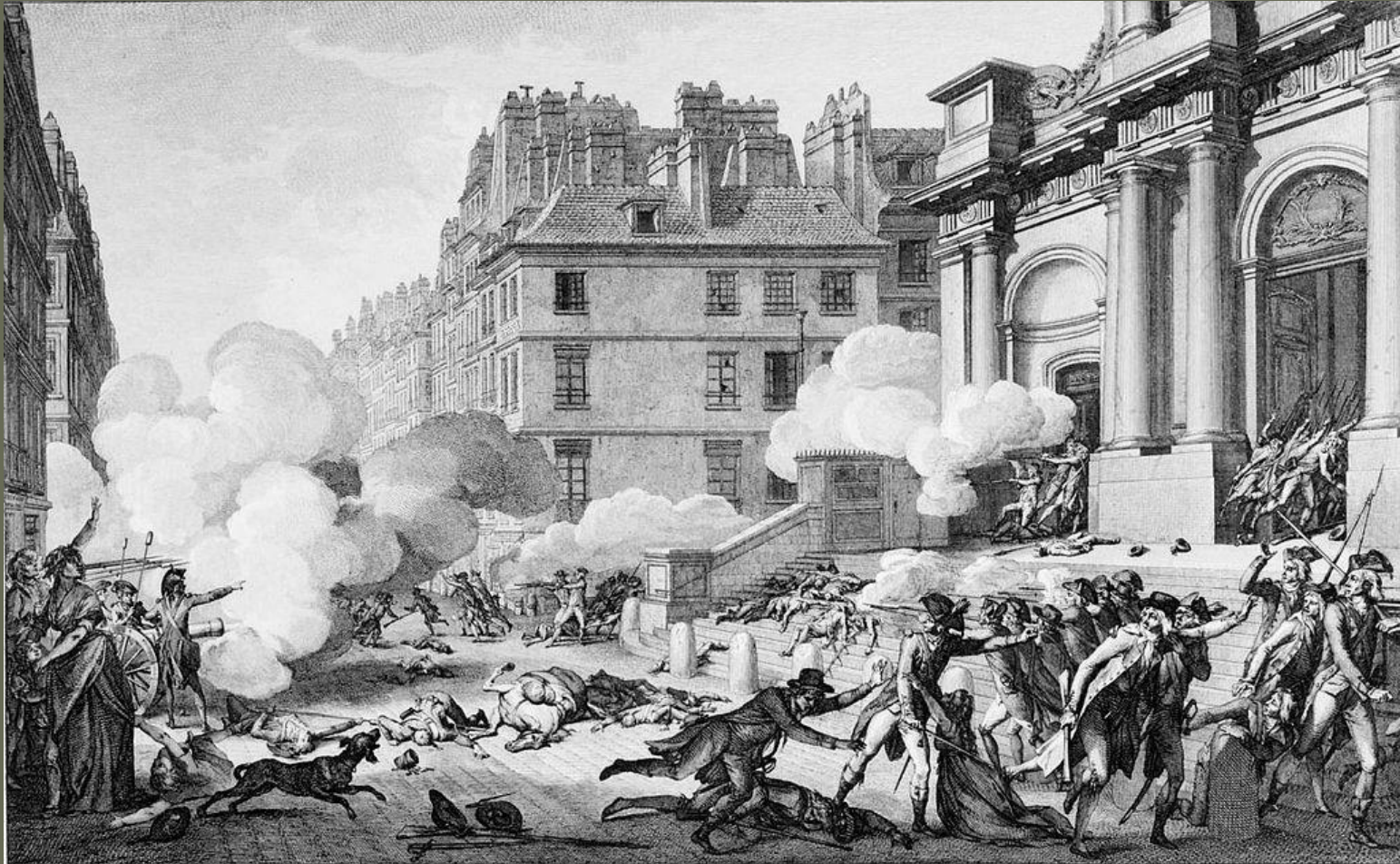
Napoleon

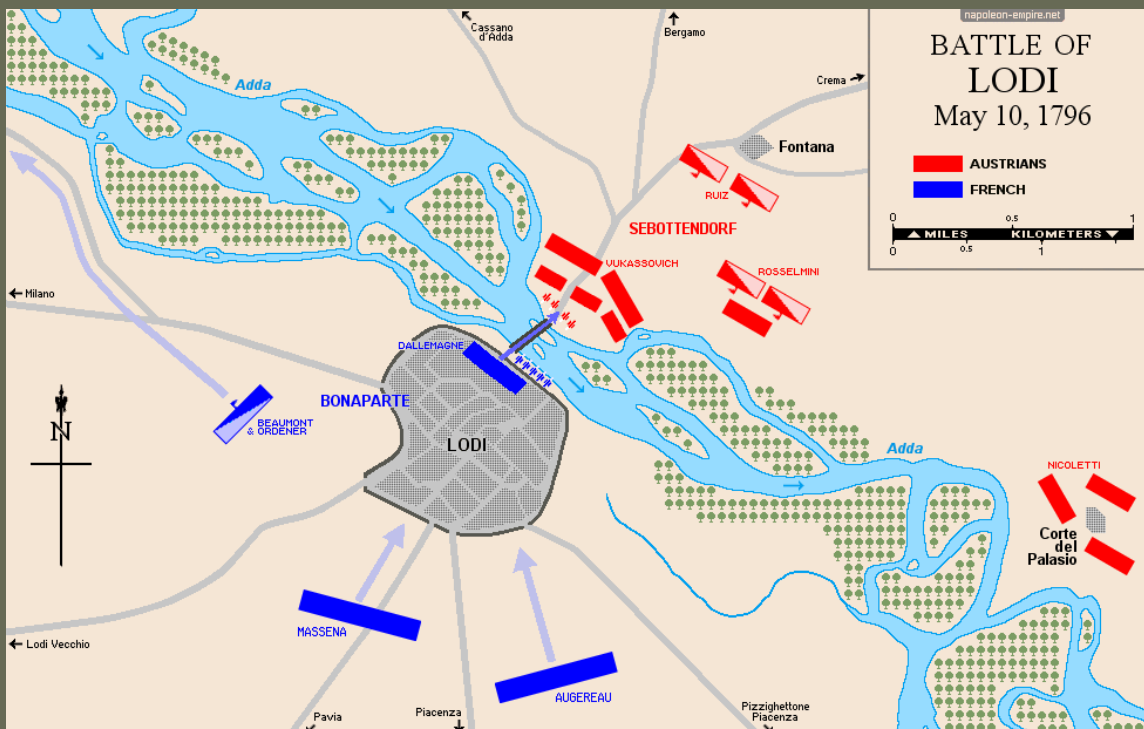

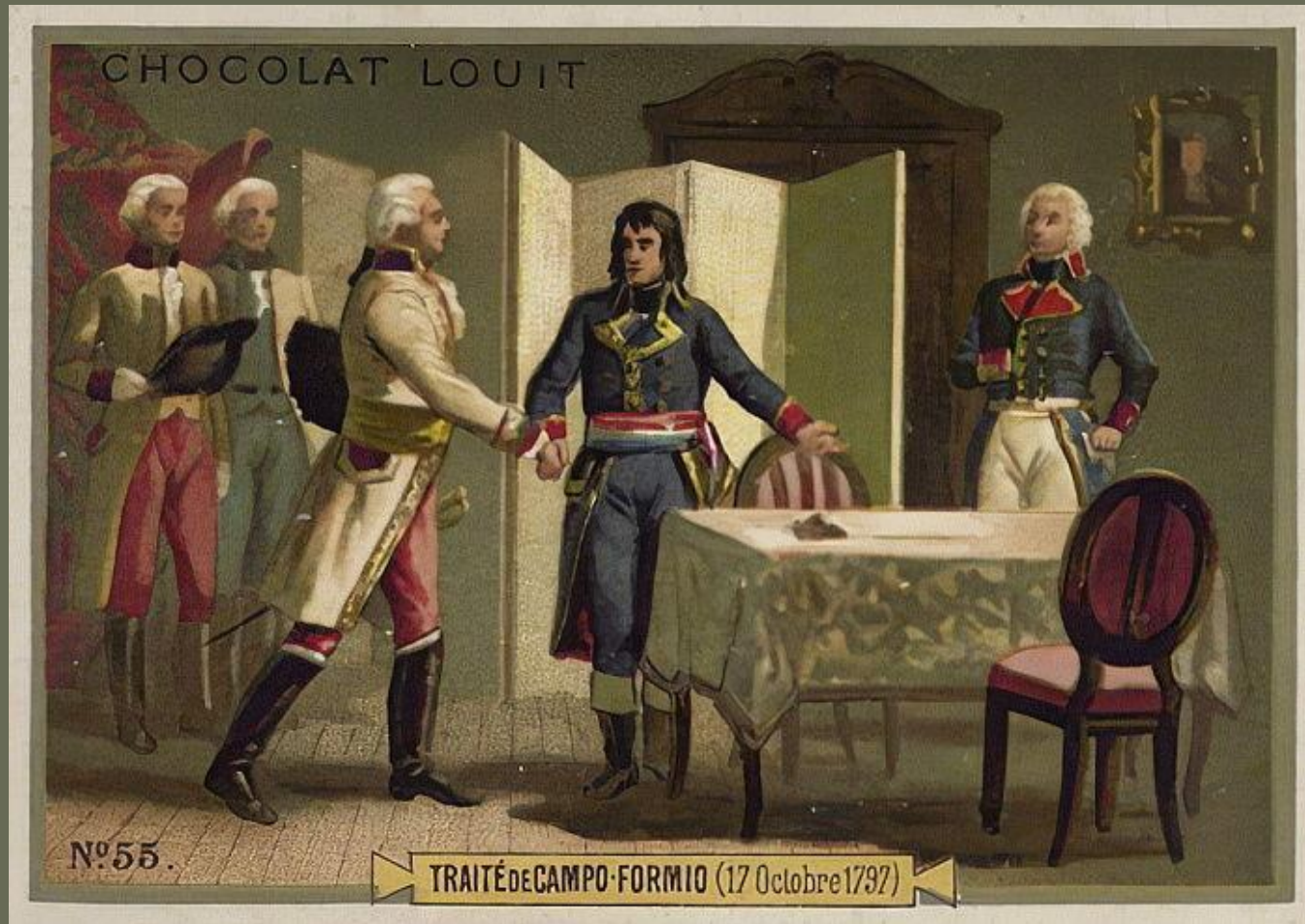

Concordat of 1801

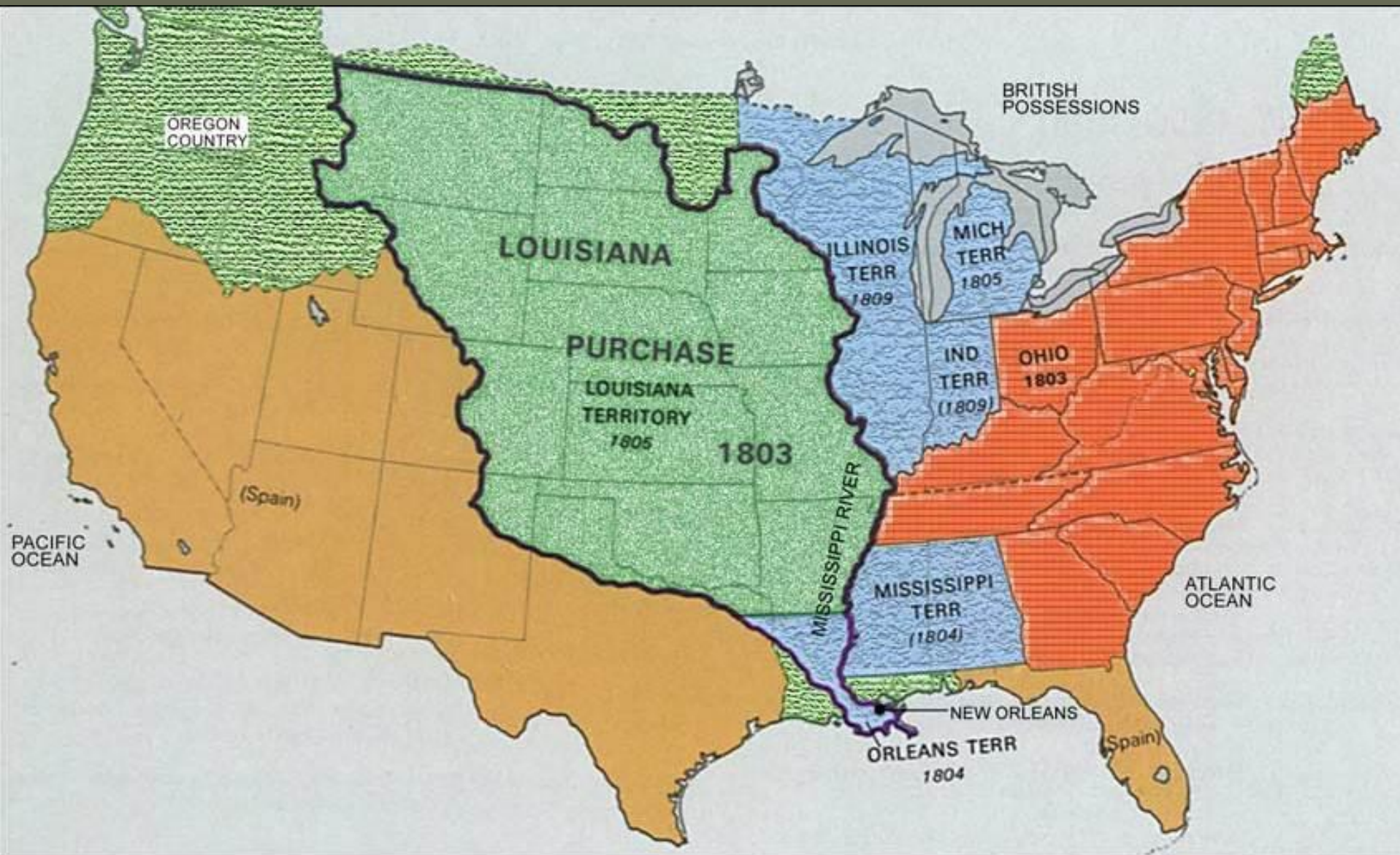
- Reconciliation between Catholic Church and the Rev.
- Catholicism the “majority” religion but gave religious freedom
- Did not restore Church lands
- Nap. Thus remained in control so the Pope rejected it, Nap. Arrests him

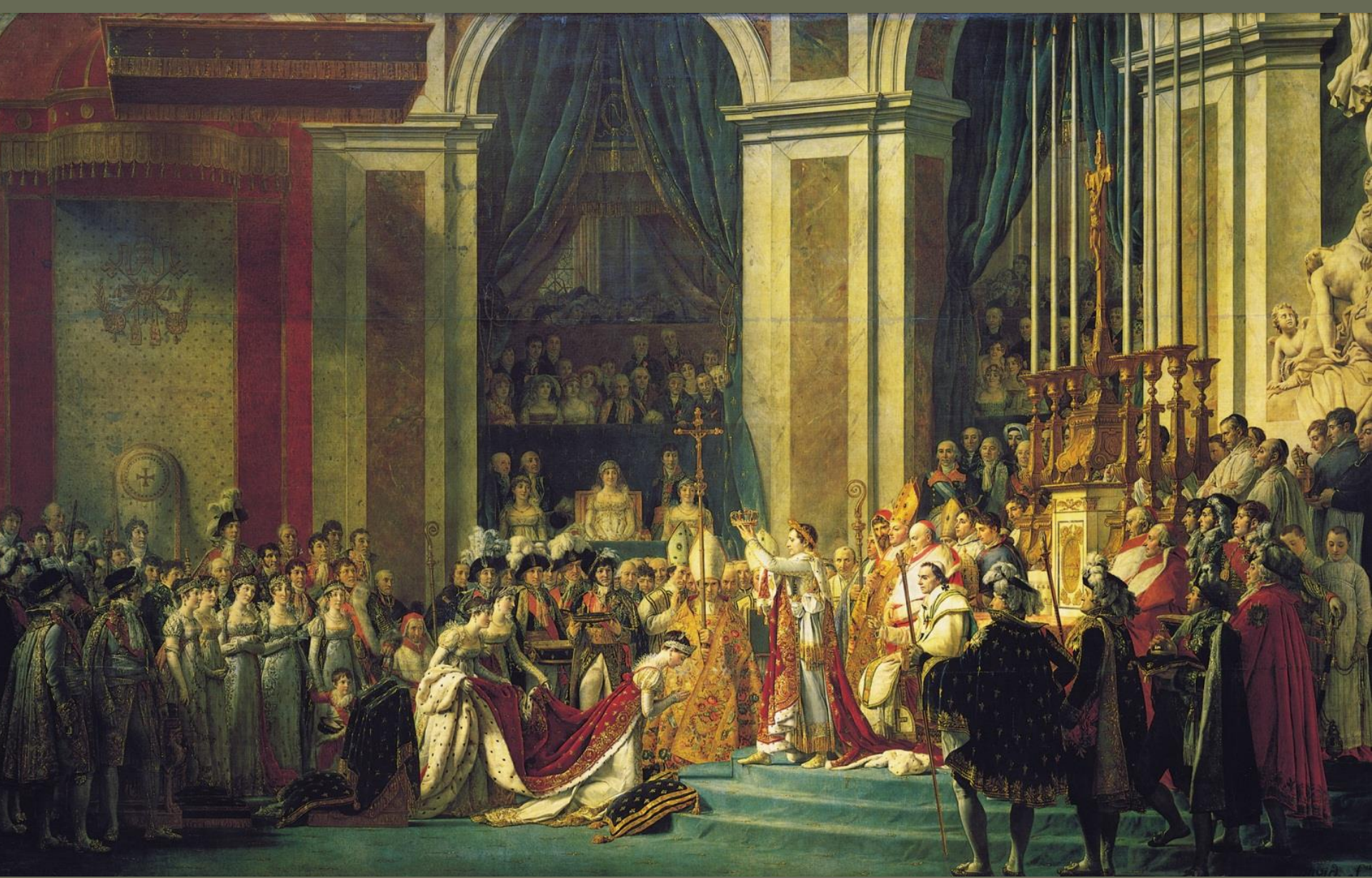

David, Napoleon's Coronation, or Consecration of the Emperor Napoleon I and Coronation of the Empress Josephine in the Cathedral of Notre-Dame de Paris on 2 December 1804.





Ingres, *Napoleon on his Imperial Throne*, Paris, 1806

In his right hand he holds the sceptre of Charlemagne and in his left the hand of justice. On his head is a golden laurel wreath, similar to one wore by Caesar. He also wears an ermine hood under the great collar of the Légion d'honneur Note eagle

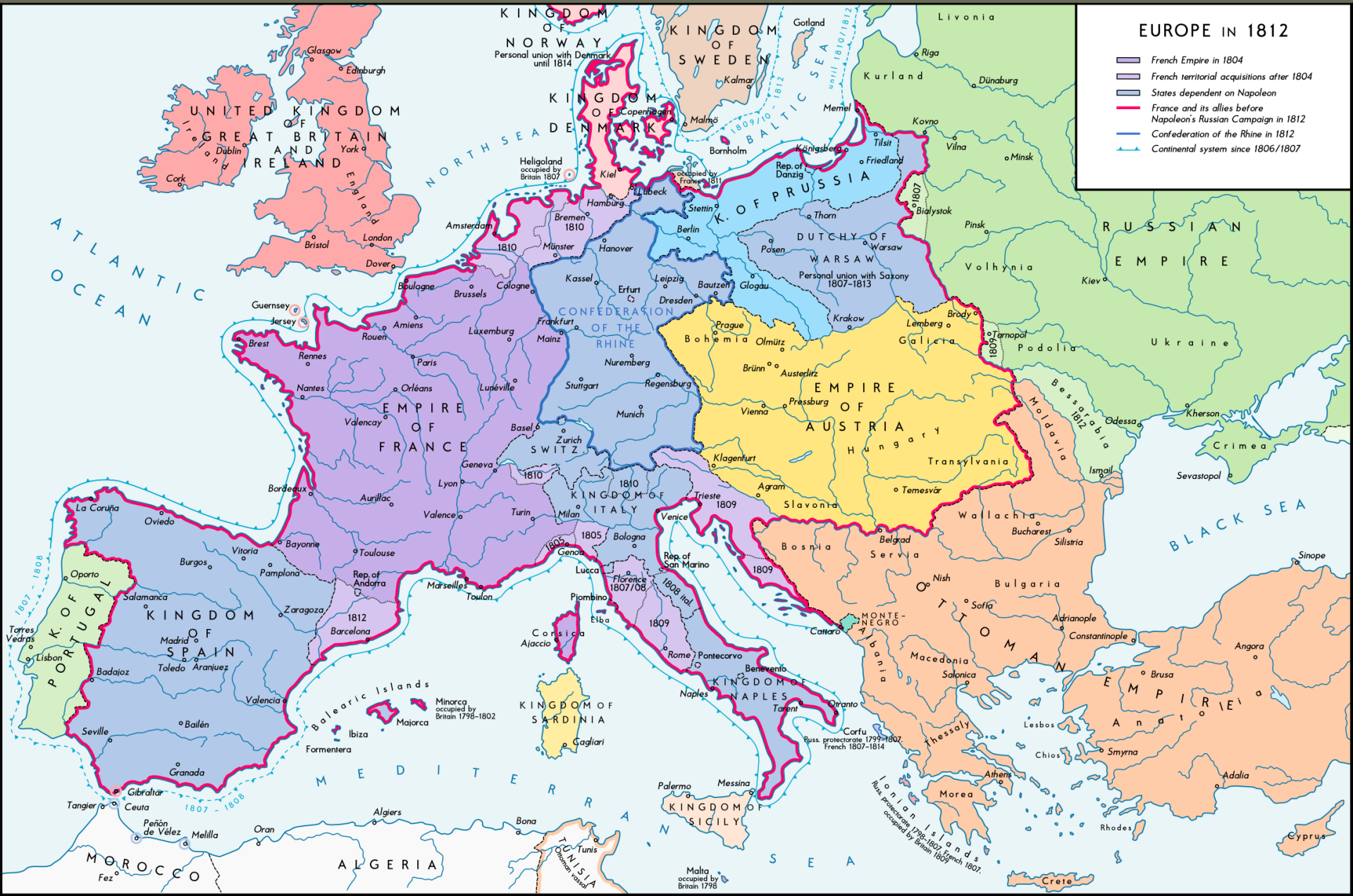
NAPOLEONIC EUROPE, 1805–1815
