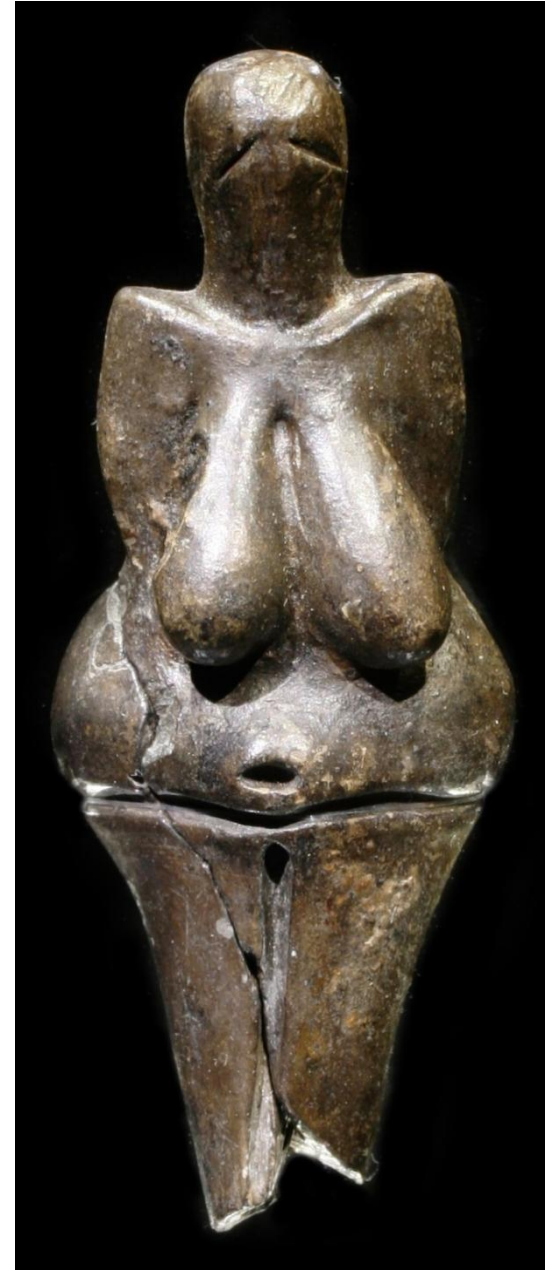




Figure (Paleolithic Austria, c.24,000 BCE)

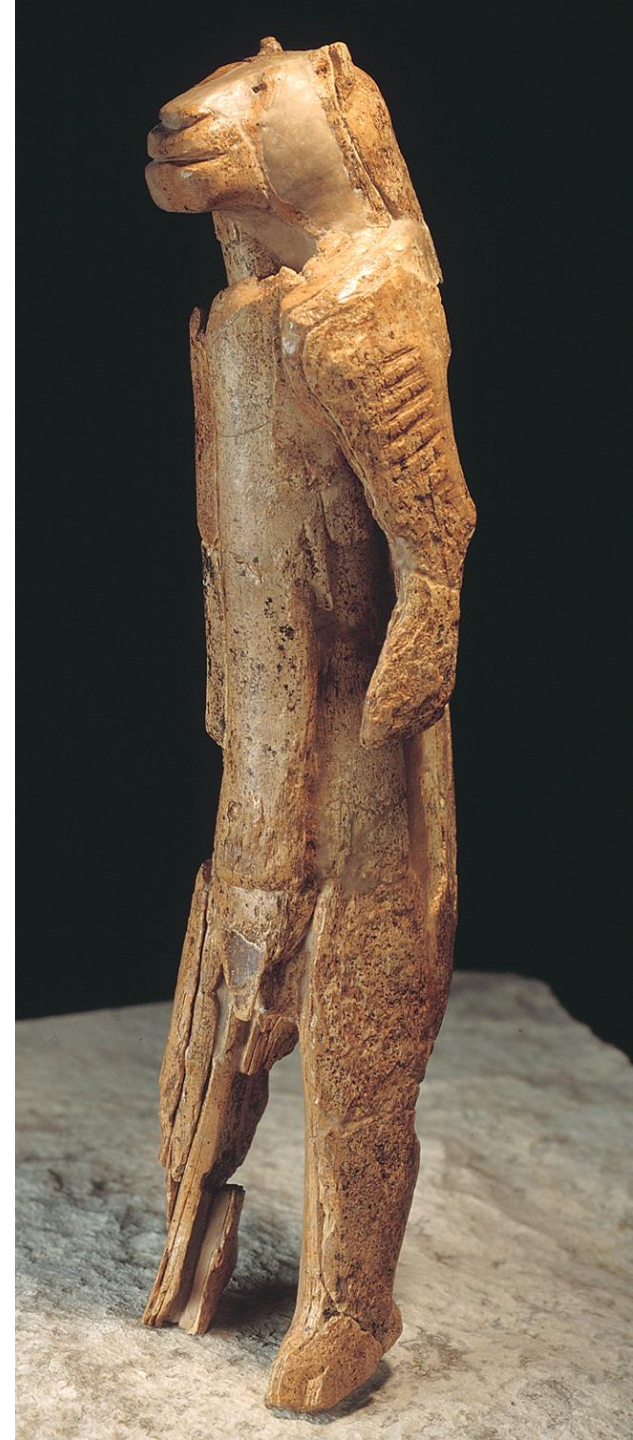


Relief figure (Paleolithic France, c.20,000 BCE)

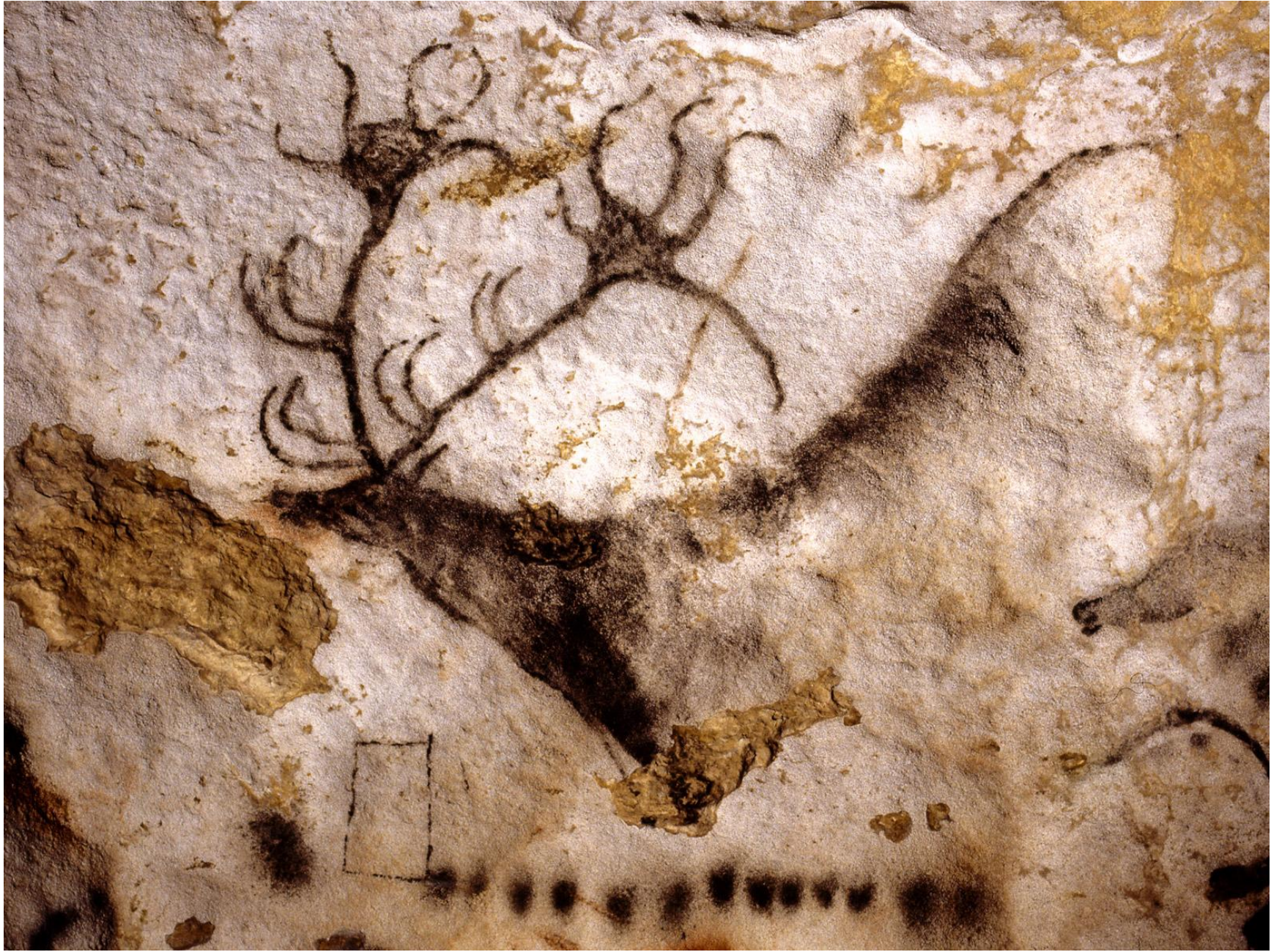




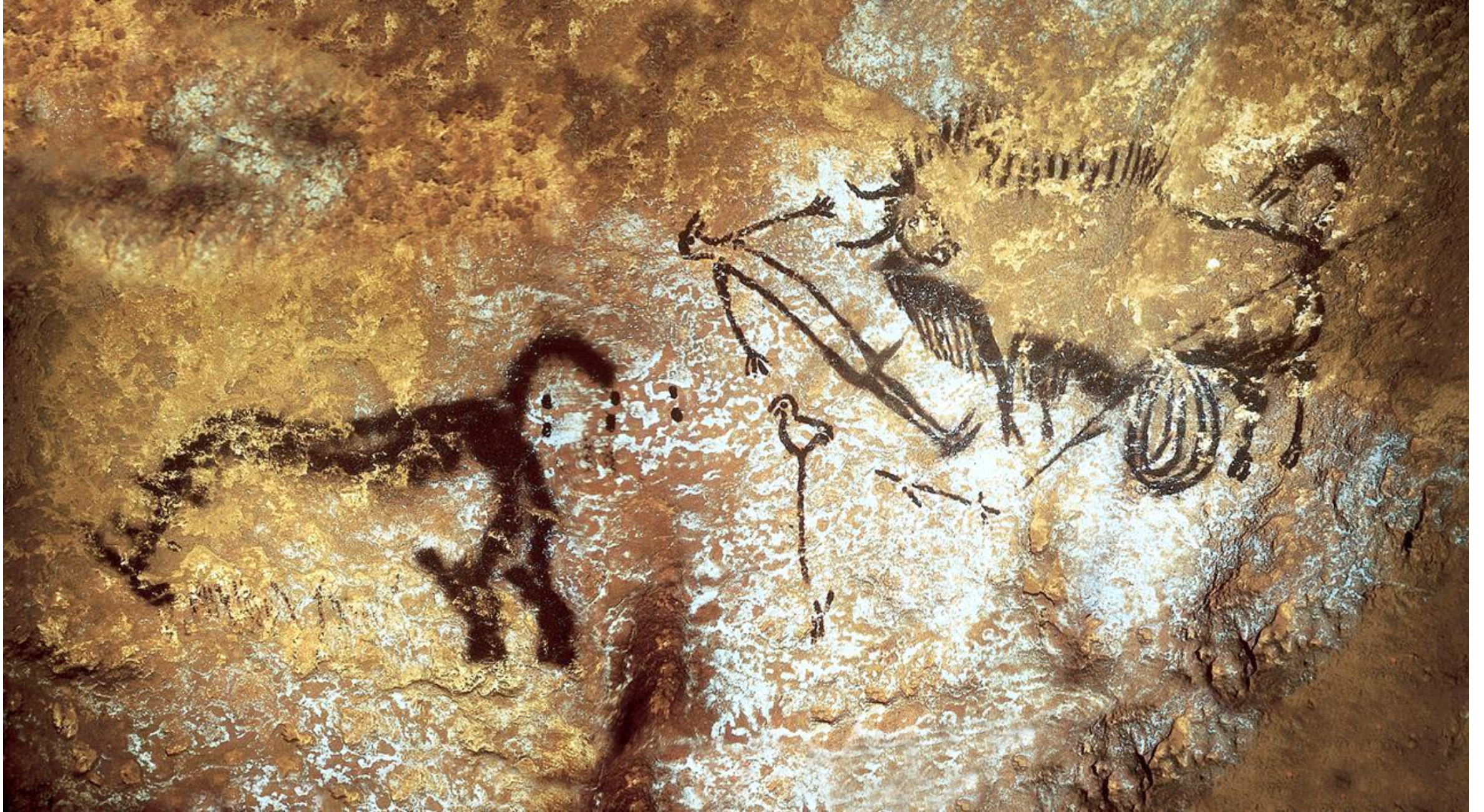

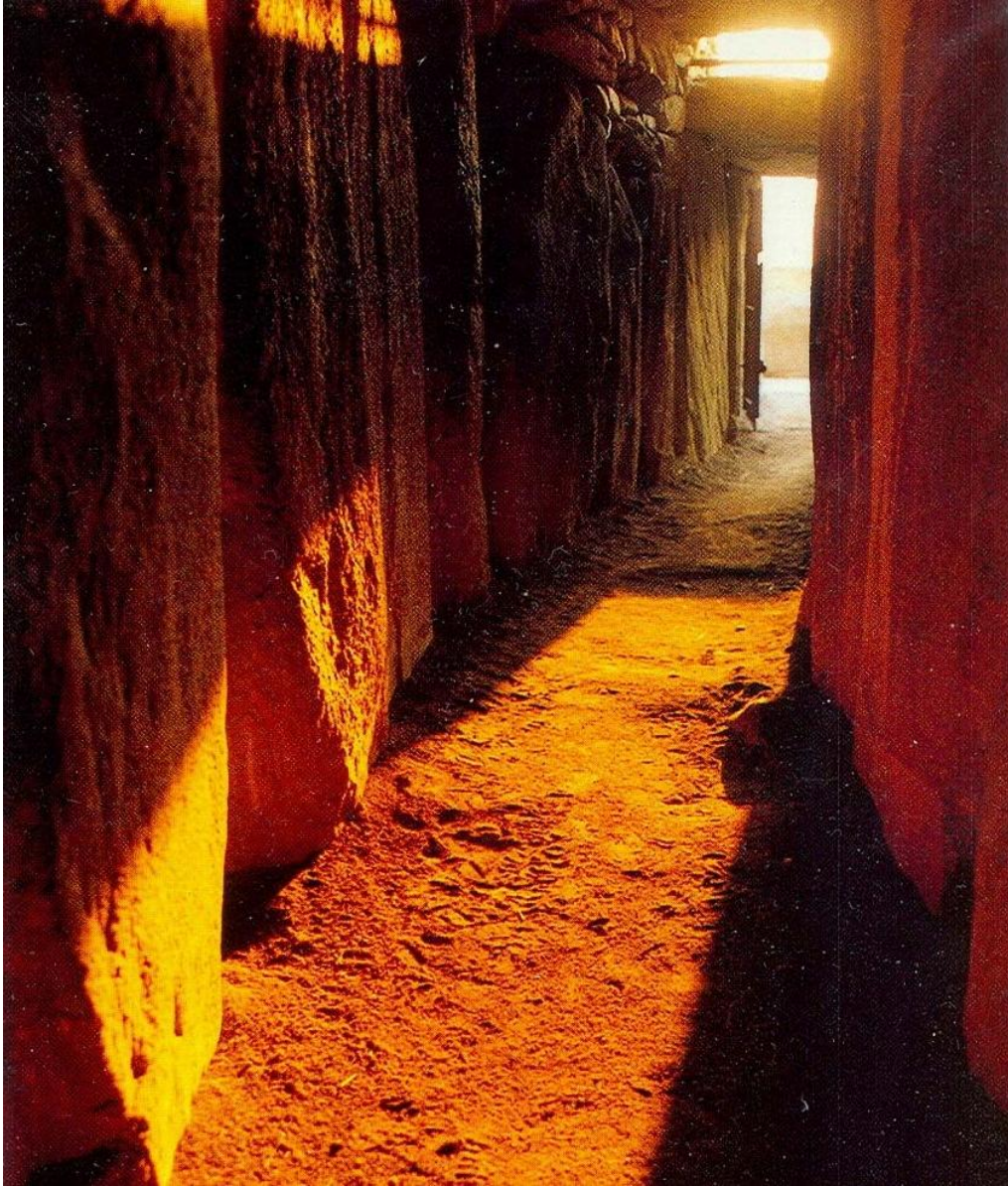




Tomb in Newgrange (Neolithic Ireland, c.2,500 BCE)

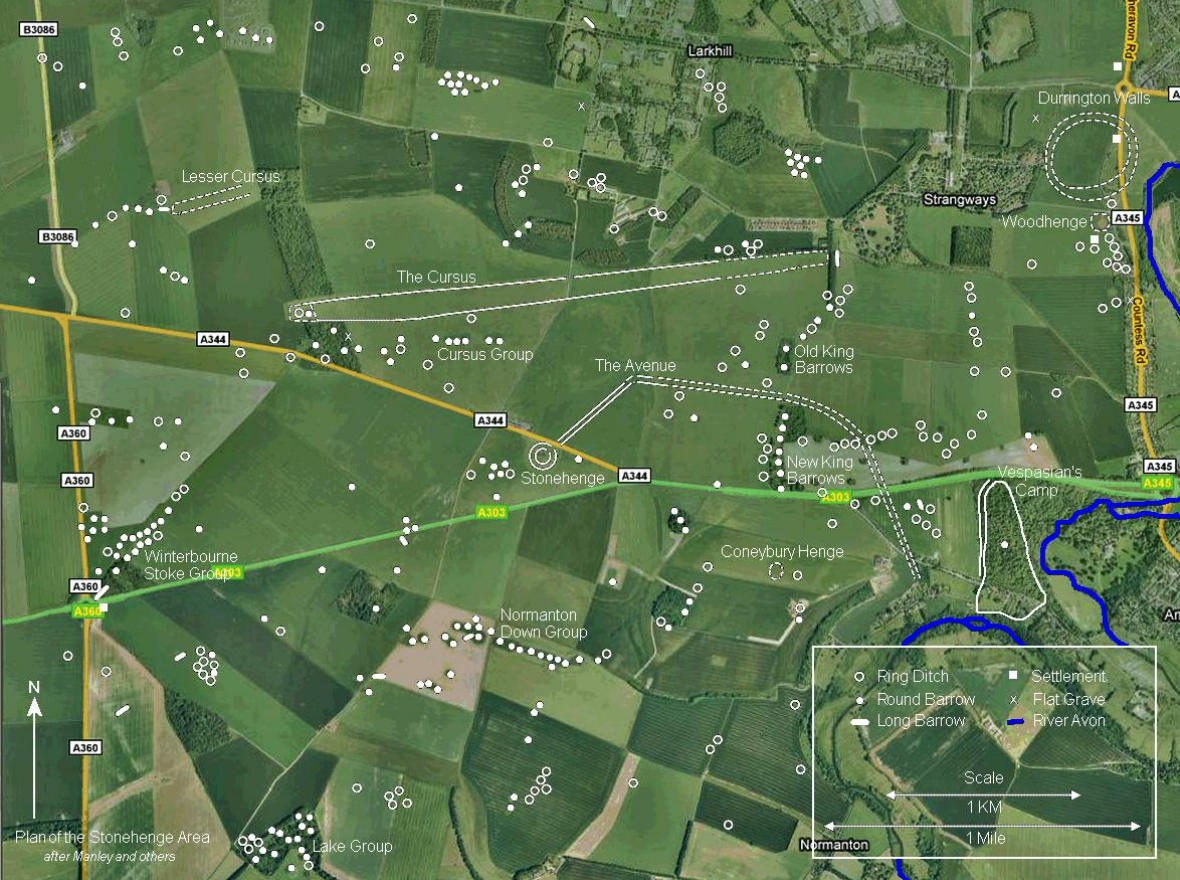


Tomb interior, Newgrange (c.2,500 BCE – including the passage illuminated by the sun on the Winter Solstice)
